

Reflecting on the Love of God in Scripture

Reflecting on Scripture in prayerful reflection is one way to draw close to God and meditate on his love for you. Each day take one of the "love passages" shown below and dwell with it.

- John 3:16
- Mark 12:28-30
- John 14:21-24
- John 15:9-17
- Matthew 5:43-48
- Romans 5:8

As you begin, ask God to receive the grace of both knowing and expressing his love in your life.

Read the passage slowly – perhaps more than once, dwelling on lines or phrases that seem to connect with you. Consider what they say and how this speaks to you. Share with God thoughts and questions that emerge. Then read the passage again and let it lead you into a time of simply resting in God's presence.

# **5 Ways to Love God**

**Be obedient.** Obedience is one of the ways we can actively show God that we love Him. Jesus tells us that if we love Him, we will obey Him. Is there an area of your life where you struggle and God is asking you to turn that difficulty over to Him? Is there something God is asking you to do, but you don't want to do it? *Be obedient to God.* 

**Be thankful.** We receive so many things from the Lord and should be thankful, but we struggle sometimes to see the good. Develop a thankful heart. Remind yourself that even though things may seem like they are going wrong, there are gifts to be found. *Thanks be to God.* 

**Be generous.** Jesus tells us that how we treat others matters. If we see someone in need and we give to them, we are giving to Jesus. *Help somebody today*.

**Be creative.** God is a creative God and we are made in God's image. We are designed to be creative beings and it pleases God when we use our creativity to glorify and praise Him. *I am creative because I am a child of God*.

**Be faithful.** God has given each of us a job to do and sometimes that job frustrates us and makes us want to quit. God asks us to walk faithfully in it until it's time to move on. *Don't give up!*



South Side Churches Meeting Saturday, January 13, 2018 – 11 AM Hickory Hills Hosting

#### **News from Our Churches**

- Calvary is hosting their monthly community meal tonight, January 13, 2018. They also report that they have joined with Faith United to schedule a monthly event to unit youth groups.
- Faith United will host their monthly community meal on Thursday, January 18, 2018. They have received approval to build a pavilion on their property. There is a baked potato bar fundraiser scheduled for Friday, January 26, 2018, 4:30 PM 7:30 PM. Their personnel committee is searching to hire a custodian.
- Pullman is gearing up to participate in a Martin Luther King, Jr. Day event.
- Morgan Park continues their discernment process to determine God's call on their congregation as well as learning more about their community. They will be hosting the meet and greet event at 10 AM on February 3, 2018, to meet the new Executive Presbyter for the Chicago Presbytery, Rev. Sue Krummel.
- Burbank reports that they are sharing their church with two other congregations. Careful scheduling has made this partnership a success.
- HHPC is ready to submit their Ministry Information Form for approval and begin their search for a Designated Pastor.

## **Updates on Mission Projects**

- Safe Gatherings Workshop on January 13, 2018, had
   19 in attendance--1 Presbytery, 1 MC8, 3 HHPC,
   2 Calvary, 3 Morgan Park, 6 Faith United, 2 Pullman,
   and 1 Burbank representative.
- Loretta Gratias-Bremer presented an informative, thought-provoking, and question-provoking program. Calvary has a policy in place. It was decided that Ben Heimach-Snipes, Rachel Jones, and Fran (from Calvary) will work together to craft a policy template. This template could potentially be brought to Presbytery lawyers for review and ten individual congregations could personalize it as needed and present it to their insurance carriers as well. It was noted that the Glen Ellyn Church also has a policy that has been adopted by other churches across the Presbytery.
- One recommended resource to read is *Careful Grace* written by Simon Bass.
- Jones Breakfast with Santa.--We served 173 kids and 74 adults (not including volunteers).
- Rockport, TX.--Sally and Ben Bourque-Layscak and John Fyfe traveled to service. Every day they are given a different project to work on. What can we do here in our congregations to support this cause?
   Support Church World Service to create cleaning and hygiene kits and school supplies, too.
- Potential July 29<sup>th</sup> Church World Service Hands-on Mission Event at HHPC, 3 PM.
   Melanie to research the greatest need and ask about John giving a presentation on the Rockport mission experience.

**Meet and Greet at Morgan Park** for our new Presbytery Executive, Rev. Sue Krummel, and our MC8 churches on Saturday, February 3, 2018 from 10 AM – 1 PM. There will be time for introductions and conversation, followed by lunch. The meal will be provided by the hosting church. Other churches are asked to bring dessert to share. Please RSVP by January 28 to be able to plan for lunch. **It was voted for MC8 to sponsor lunch from the general fund up to \$300.** 

**Potential MC8 Gathering with Jan Edmiston and Denise Anderson** – John Fyfe, Lynn LaBine will follow up.

**Dakota Partnership** – begin to focus on our \$4,000 goal to help pay for a semi-truck full of fresh produce to distribute to local a Native-American community. Bring this goal to Sessions and report back what your commitment will be. Promote the collection of swim suits and towels for VBS.
