

2 REFLECTIONS

Meditations on Jesus' Last Words

FIRST WORDS (FORGIVENESS) "Father, forgive them for they know not what they do."

Prayer:

Jesus, when You looked down from the cross and saw the terrible eyes of your enemies, those who had beaten You, laughed at You, cursed at You, watching and waiting for You to die, You still could see the love Your Father had for them, and You asked that they be forgiven. Lord, when I need to forgive someone, let me not be blinded by pain and anger so much that I can no longer love them.

Reflection: Is there someone in my life I need to forgive?

SECOND WORDS (REPENTANCE) "Today, you will be with me in Paradise."

Prayer:

Jesus, when those You loved wished to crush all hope from You, leaving You hanging on the cross in misery and despair, You offered hope to the one crucified beside You. Jesus, give me hope beyond all hope so that I may share it with those who are filled with misery, sadness, or loneliness. And one day when my time is near, let me take Your hand and enter into Paradise.

Reflection: Is there someone that I can share hope with today?

THIRD WORDS (INTERCESSION) "Woman, here is your Son."

Prayer:

Jesus, I see Your mother at the foot of the cross and it engages my heart. I see that You are no longer only the Savior who died for my sins and the sins of the world, but You were also a man, fully human, a Son with a mother. Your unfailing love for Your mother is shown as you entrusted her to the care of your disciple John. And even as you were dying, Your mother was Your first intention. *Reflection:* What feelings does Jesus' mother's presence under the cross stir up in my heart?

FOURTH WORDS (HEALING) "My God, My God, why have You forsaken me?"

Prayer:

Jesus, Your Father's love was Your only reason for living, for loving. As life poured out of You, You felt abandoned by that love. There was only silence, when once you heard a voice saying, "You are my beloved Son." And yet you prayed, You offered all that was left to You-- the emptiness that had gripped Your heart. Lord Jesus, let me enter more deeply into Your love. Let me understand that I cannot give without receiving nor receive without giving. Help me to understand that You were abandoned so that I might <u>not</u> be.

Reflection: Do I take time to consider that Jesus was abandoned by the Father so that I might not be abandoned?

> FIFTH WORDS "I am thirsty!"

Prayer:

Jesus, besides this extraordinary physical pain, you also experienced extreme thirst. As I think of your words "I am thirsty," I hear the cry of my own heart, but not for a physical drink, but a spiritual one. I pray that You quench my thirst with Your Presence in my life.

Reflection: Reflect on your thirst for Jesus in your life.

SIXTH WORDS (TRUST) "It is finished!"

Prayer:

Jesus, how can I ever find words to express my gratitude to You. You did it. You finished that for which You had been sent. You were faithful in life and faithful in death. You accomplished that which no other person could ever do-taking the sin of the world upon Your shoulders, taking my sin so that I might receive Your forgiveness. All praise to you, Lord Jesus, for finishing the work so that I might be saved.

Reflection: It is beyond comprehension to think that the crucifixion happened to somebody, and not just anybody, but to my Lord and Savior. Have I expressed my gratitude to Jesus for dying for me?


SEVENTH WORDS (PERSEVERANCE) "Father, into Your Hands I commend my spirit!"


Prayer:

Jesus, how good it is to know that the cross was not the end for You. As you entrusted Your spirit into Your Father's hands, You did so in anticipation of what was to come. So, I reflect upon Your death, not in despair, but in hope. Hope that one day I, too, shall commend my spirit into Your Hands.

Reflection: Have I put my life into God's hands?


A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. John 13:34
