Summer: A Time for God, A Time for Nature, A Time for Me

Summertime offers us a wonderful opportunity to connect with God and nature as we enjoy the beautiful outdoors. Nature's landscapes can be the perfect backdrop for spending some quiet, quality time with God.

The following are a few suggestions on how you might connect with God and nature this summer.

Create your own sacred space outdoors. Find a place in your backyard, or on your balcony or patio where you can sit for as little or as long as time allows, preferably in the morning, when you are refreshed and ready to receive God's blessings for the day. Spend this time with God in prayer, meditation and conversation while also enjoying your morning coffee or beverage. Then allow yourself some time to sit and listen as your spirit awakens to God's peace and guidance.

There are many beautiful parks, forest preserves and meditation gardens nearby where you can walk or drive to and enjoy a peaceful time with the Lord. If you drive, carry along a lawn chair in your trunk so that you'll always have quick access to seating. You may also want to carry along your Bible or a meditation book should you find a spot amid nature where you can relax, read and reflect.

As you focus on the beauty of God's creation around you, write some prayers of thanksgiving for each object of nature that you see—trees, flowers, grass, the sun, blue skies, etc. You'll be amazed at how many things in nature can stir up gratitude in your heart. If you enjoy poetry, the summer landscapes might also inspire you to write a beautiful poem about your observations.

Our phone cameras allow us to take amazing pictures. Take pictures of nature and later skim through your image gallery and pick out the ones that stimulate prayerful thoughts.

In the evening while outdoors, light a candle and let the flickering light bring about any special thoughts and prayers. Flickering LED candles can also be purchased that mimic the same lovely glow.

Play some beautiful instrumental or spiritual music as you sit outdoors, either on your phone or on a radio and enjoy the music as its vibrations stir your soul. (Digital TV offers some music channels with soothing "soundscape" music.)

In addition to picture taking, cell phones allow us to record video and sound. There are many natural settings such as fountains in nearby parks, waterfalls at nature centers, sounds of birds in the trees, leaves blowing in the summer breeze, a summer rainstorm. By recording these sights and sounds, you can bring them up on the screen and escape to a peaceful place.

God has blessed us with a beautiful world. Let's all try to make time to get out and enjoy it.

Women's Bible Study "Sharing at the Table"

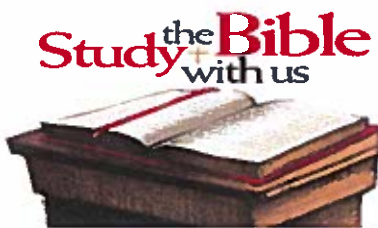

In 1988, the law was unanimously amended by both the House and the Senate and signed into law by President Ronald Reagan on Thursday, May 5, 1988, designating the first Thursday of May as a day of national prayer. Every president since 1952 has signed a National Day of Prayer proclamation.

Prayer reminds us that we are created in God's image and He desires for us to represent Him everywhere we go. Prayer brings UNITY. In 2018, our theme will be Pray for America – UNITY, based upon Ephesians 4:3 which challenges us to mobilize unified public prayer for America, "Making every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace."

Our hope is that individuals, churches, and spiritual leaders in America, will humble themselves and unify in prevailing prayer for the next great move of God in America. We can come together in clear agreement that this is our greatest need. We can become a visible union, standing together in prayer. We can pray more than ever before, and practice extraordinary prayer for the next great move of God in America that will catapult the message of the gospel nationally and internationally.

John Fyfe from Faith United Presbyterian will share about his experience serving in hurricane devastated Rockport, Texas, we will worship through service by packing hygiene kits, then of course, we will share in a potluck meal. Chicken, bread, and salad will be provided. Please bring a side dish or dessert to share.

PLEASE COLLECT ITEMS FROM THE LIST BELOW TO BRING TO THE EVENT

CWS Hygiene Kit

Supplies needed:

- One hand towel measuring approximately 15"x 28" to 16"x 32"
- (no fingertip, bath, dish towel or micro-fiber)
- One washcloth
- One wide-tooth comb removed from the package
- One finger nail or toe nail clipper removed from the package
- One bath size bar of soap in the wrapper
- One toothbrush in the package
- Ten standard size Band-aids

All items need to fit inside a one-gallon plastic zipper closure bag. Remove the excess air from the bag and seal before boxing. Do not add any extra items or toothpaste. A tube of extended expiration date toothpaste will be added to each Hygiene Kit just prior to its journey.

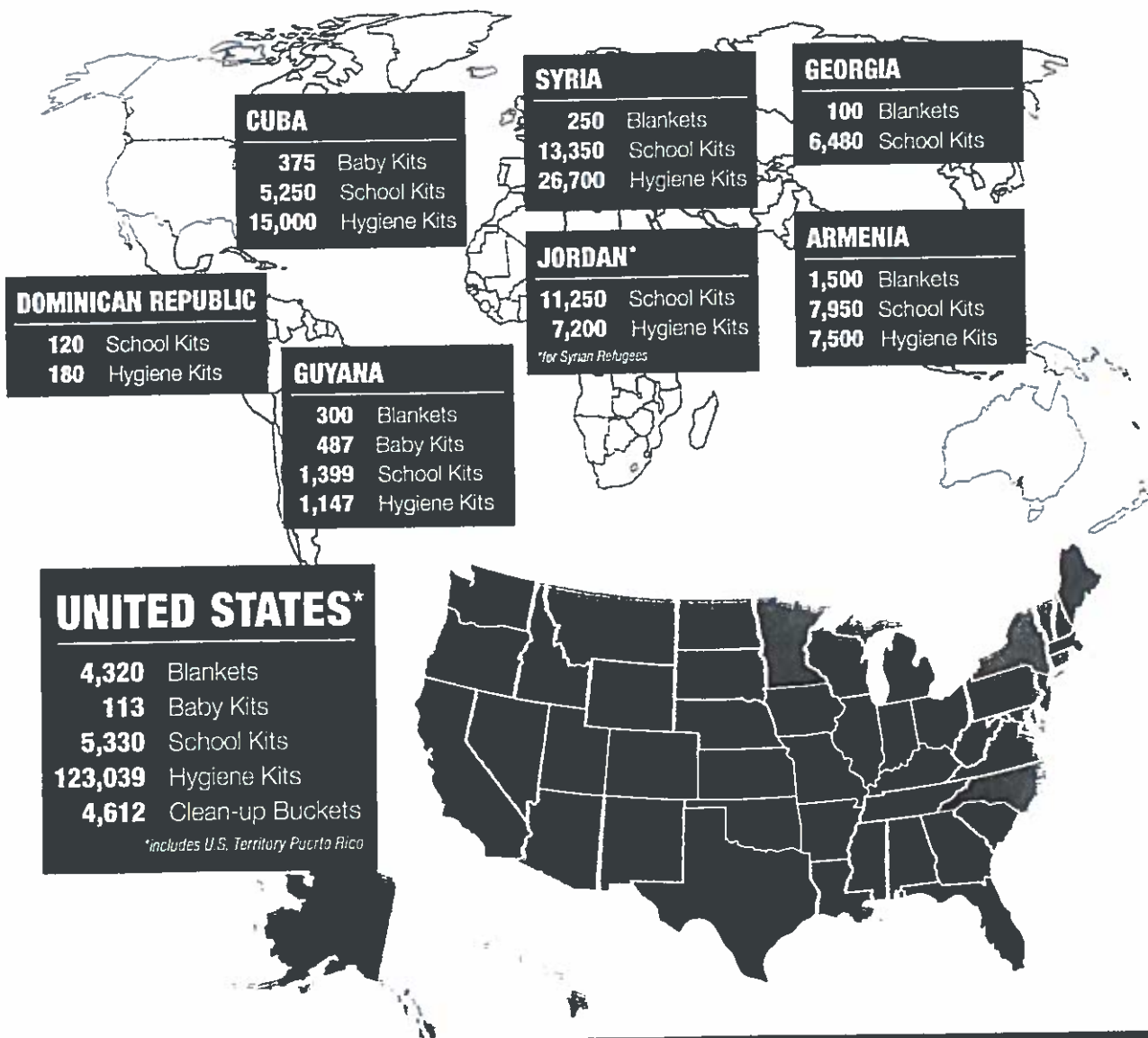
