### **Reflecting on the Colors of Fall**

As the leaves begin to change into an array of beautiful fall colors of yellow, orange, red and brown, we are reminded of how we, like the leaves, are changing throughout the seasons of our lives.

Let's look at some of the meanings of color that have been written about and how we might apply them to our faith life.

**Yellow.** Yellow represents joy and happiness. If we have God in our lives, joy is present in our hearts and will shine forth.

- Am I essentially happy and are others drawn to me because they see joy and happiness in me?
- In my relationship with God, when do I feel the most joyful?
- What makes me happy in my faith journey with others?

**Orange.** Orange represents warmth and symbolizes thoughtfulness and sincerity. As a Christian, I am asked to be a warm and inviting person who cares about others.

- Do I portray an image of warmth, thoughtfulness and sincerity and can others see these qualities in me?
- In Colossians 3:12, it is written: "Clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience." Do I "clothe" myself with these traits?

#### **Reflecting on the Colors of Fall** (continued)

**Red.** Red represents love, passion and desire. Having a heart full of passion draws us closer to God and others.

- What makes me feel passionate in my faith life?
- How do I think God can use my passion to reach out to others?
- What do I find really easy and fun? (*This could be my passion!*)

**Brown**. Brown represents stability and anchors all those other beautiful colors of fall. In our lives,

we have God as our anchor and we can depend on Him for strength and security.

- Do I remember to be God-anchored when I feel unstable and insecure in my life?
- When I am worried and overwhelmed, I will remember these words:

I won't tell God how big my storm is. I'll tell my storm how big my God is.

Take time to reflect as you experience God's awesome gift of Fall colors.

### **GREAT WAYS TO CELEBRATE** SOMEONE'S BIRTHDAY
