Food for Thought: New Year Resolutions to Consider

For many, the New Year ushers in a variety of resolutions for change that will improve life in the coming year.

The following are some suggestions that you might consider in 2019 and perhaps beyond.

• Engage with people more than texting them.

Looking at a phone is quick and doesn't demand much at all. Texting is easier than talking—it gives you a form of intimacy without getting too close. This year, resolve to spend more time looking into someone's eyes when you communicate with them. Replace a text with a phone conversation or an invitation to meet for coffee.

• Take your soul seriously.

Slow down and be present and listen as your soul communicates with you through its wise inner voice. The more conscious you are of these moments through prayer and quiet meditation, the easier it will be to hear. Our soul's language is love and we can open our hearts to God's love and to our neighbors.

• Increase your kindness.

If you wish to feel kind, do something good. Even when you don't feel like it, be kind and the habit will grow and kindness will become a natural quality that shines through. Acts of kindness can be small or large such as a gentle word to someone, a lending hand or a listening ear to someone in need. Involvement in church missions or contributions to your favorite charity are other ways to show kindness.

• Choose someone to forgive.

We all certainly have legitimate grievances in our lives. Some people are very hard to forgive, but you need not begin with the toughest cases. Forgive the guy who cut you off in the street (keep in mind you may have cut someone off at some point too!). Forgive the person who made an unkind remark about you or whatever situation in your life is calling for forgiveness. The more you forgive, the less the world can injure you. Forgiveness is a soft shield for your soul.

• In forgiving, include yourself.

It's important to forgive yourself of the things you have done wrong and the times that you have hurt other people. You need forgiveness for the times that you have caused others pain. This will help you to be at peace with yourself. It will also improve your health and free you of any feelings caused by the wrong that has been done.

Remember that God is perfect, we are not. Don't beat yourself up for making a mistake.
