A LETTER FROM PASTOR EDIE



I am looking forward to joining you as your pastor on April 14; I am excited to see what God will do with us and to get to know all of you. In the meantime, I thought you might like to know a little more about me and my family.

I was born and raised in Grand Rapids, Michigan. I am the oldest of 4 and there are 4 ministers in my family (though not all my siblings are clergy). For the past 10 years, I have been serving First Reformed Church in Fulton, Illinois, a small town on the Mississippi River. Before that, I spent 6 years in the Lakeview/Logan Square neighborhood of Chicago serving a congregation called Church of the Good News. For me, ministry has always been about relationships, connection, and learning together. I am excited to learn from you and with you.

Preparing My Heart for Easter

As we all await the wondrous celebration of Easter, here are some ways on how we might prepare ahead as we remember Jesus' life and His resurrection.

- Reflect on the love of God expressed in Jesus' suffering--the pain, the grief, and the anguish that He experienced. Then, meditate upon the fact that Jesus rose from the dead!
- Read the resurrection accounts in each of the gospels (Matthew 28, Mark 16, Luke 24, John 20) and 1 Corinthians 15 which contains the earliest account of the post-resurrection appearances of Jesus.
- Take time to consider specific ways in which Jesus' resurrection affects your life. Write down your thoughts on paper and reflect on what you've written.
- Reflect on the fact that Jesus has gone before us to clear the way so that we may reach the Father, and then meditate on the words of Jesus:

"Do not let your hearts be troubled. Believe in God, believe also in me. In my Father's house there are many dwelling places. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, so that where I am, there you may be also." (John 14:1-3)

• Spend a few minutes in prayer each day, simply thanking God for the resurrection.


