A LETTER FROM REV. EDIE



Rev. Edie Lenz, Pastor

This past Sunday, Jesus taught his disciples (and us) that we are to be known by our love – that as his followers we should be identifiable to the world because of our love. I have been thinking a lot about this command and I wonder, what does it look like to be known for our love. I believe there is a difference between being warm and fuzzy or syrupy sweet to everyone and acting in love. I believe that acting in love means that we are willing to act for the good of another, even if it is not our preference or desire; even if it means sacrifice or intentionality on our part. All of this makes me wonder, how are we known for our love in our everyday life?

This morning I asked Caleb how it is that he brings the love of Jesus to his school. He told me that the ways he does this are: praying before school, being kind, and doing my best. Wow.

I wonder what it would look like if all of us worked at doing the same? What kind of difference would you be able to make in your workplace, home, community, and the places you go if you were to begin with prayer, act with kindness and do your best in everything?

A few years ago, I read a book about the need to create sacred space in our

world and the value of rituals that bring this space into our lives. It was then that I wrote a simple prayer and Caleb and I began to use it each morning when we got in the car to head to school. A prayer that reminded us to take a deep breath and enter our day a little calmer than things had just been, running around getting breakfast.

Bless us all today as we are separated from one another, bring us back safely. Thank you for loving us as we are.

That's it, nothing more but it helps us reframe our morning, and reminds us that we are loved by God and that we are God's people in this world. We begin each morning before school with this simple prayer.

Acting with kindness might be more difficult some days. I know there are days I am irritated, frustrated or impatient. There are days I have to remind myself that kindness is one of my values, that I am called to act in love even towards those who cut me off in traffic or are rude in the grocery store. Kindness can be an overlooked value in our culture. What difference could you make by taking an extra minute and connecting with a person, holding a door, saying hello, listening a little better to what someone is saying, offering a sincere compliment.

As you go through your day, what *random acts of kindness* might you perform as a way of living your faith. Caleb also said *doing my best*. This really gets me thinking about how I live my life. What if giving our best, doing the best work we can, was a part of the way that we showed our love for God? What if doing our best work, honoring our jobs and coworkers by doing our best work was a way of living our faith? What if being a person of my word; doing what I say I am going to do, when I say I am going to do it, in the manner it was meant to be done is a way of living in integrity with God? I wonder how often I don't give my all, only do a good enough job, or get things done eventually. What would it look like to give our best to our work, families and friends?

These are just some of the ways we can bring the love of Jesus into our everyday lives. I wonder, what was stirred up in you as you read this. Can you think of other ways we, as individuals, or as a congregation, can be living in love?

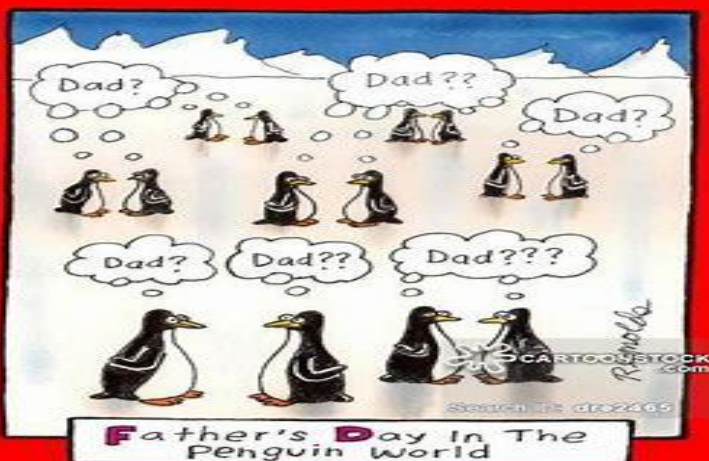

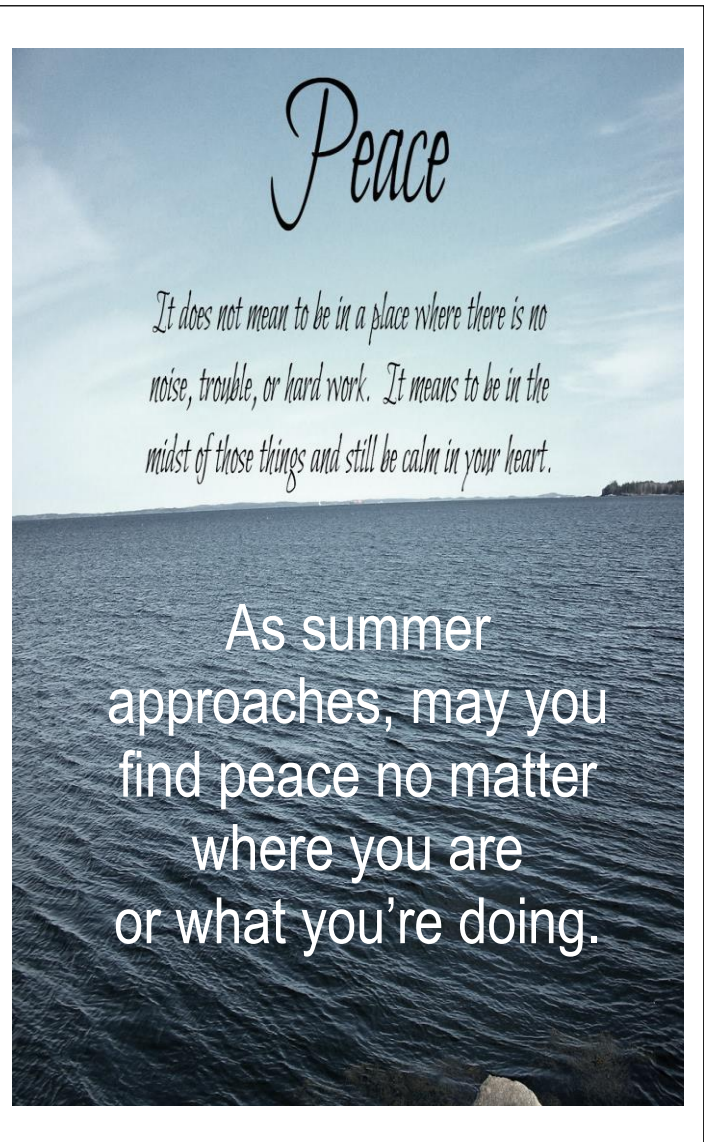
