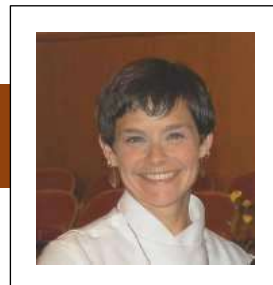

# A LETTER FROM REV. EDIE



Rev. Edie Lenz, Pastor

I have spent much of my first 4 months listening, observing and learning. I have spoken one on one with most of session, about half of the deacons and several other members of the church. I have listened to conversations around tables, events, and REV Gatherings. In my listening I have looked for common themes, things that come up over and over. I have listened to know not just individuals better, but Hickory Hills Presbyterian Church as a whole. I shared my learning with Session this week and I wanted to share a taste of what I learned with you.

What follows are a set of values – values I have heard you say are a core of who you are, they are deeply held, and they are imperfectly practiced.

**Relationships.** Close ties, family atmosphere, deep connections to one another. You are here because this is family, you have stuck it out and stayed together because you deeply love one another and you deeply love Hickory Hills Pres. You have created wide and broad relationships that extend beyond just church membership.

**Shared leadership.** The gifts and skills of the leaders are wide and varied. As needs have arisen, people have stepped into leadership. Very few of you report doing work you do not really want to be doing. While leadership is shared, there is a general sense of camaraderie and appreciation

for the work of others. This means that leaders are not siloed in an area refusing to interact with other leaders, but also do not hesitate to delegate work to appropriate places.

**Mission/Service.** Mission isn't just about sending money, though you are generous and intentional in your work. Mission is about getting hands dirty and serving others. There is a deeply-held passion for service; your history of mission trips and other events has deeply shaped who you are. Making an impact, not just showing up for worship is deeply important to many in the church.

**Hard work.** As you are very busy people (not just in the church), you work hard and that hard work extends to the hours you have spent in helping Hickory Hills Pres survive all it has been through in the past several years. The members of the church don't just stop working at retirement, almost everyone who is physically able is engaged in working for or with others, one way or another.

**Multi-generational.** Human beings are valued, regardless of age and ability. You have created safe spaces for those of varying abilities, ages, and gifts. You long to find new ways to increase that impact; particularly with children and youth.

**Tenacity.** You are a stubborn group whose survival and ability to thrive have been built on your determination to keep moving forward. You have endured much, experienced much, and still you

stand. The core of faithful members who are here show a passion and a resolve to move forward in life together.

I offer these to you as observations. I would encourage you to wonder, consider and push back if I am wrong or affirm where I might be right. None of these values is perfectly practiced, there is much room for improvement in any one; but my hope is that a clear snapshot of who we are will help us see what work we have to do in order to move forward into the future God is preparing for us.

**Will you join us on September 21 for a Visioning Retreat here at Hickory Hills Pres as we look at more of what I have observed and seek to set goals and plans for the coming year?**

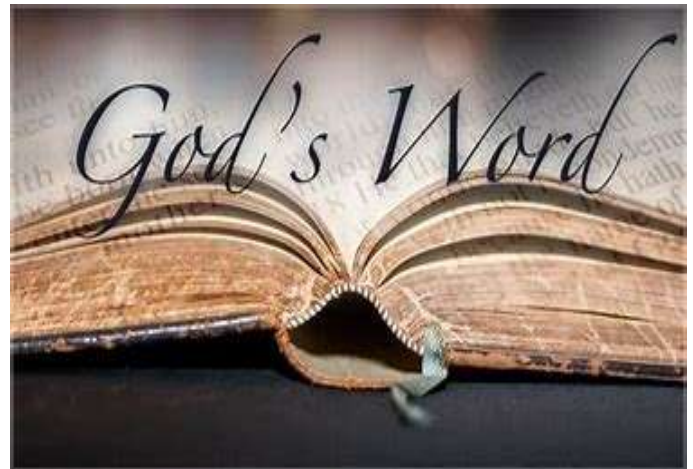
