A LETTER FROM REV. EDIE

The month of October

has traditionally been set aside in the church as a month of Stewardship, in part, because practically speaking the year end is coming and we need to be sure we have accounted for all the commitments we have made as a congregation, including not just our bills but our commitments to support missions and ministries outside our doors. It is also the time of year that new budgets are created and pledges are taken so that wise decisions for the coming year can be made. But stewardship is not just about the monies taken in or used by the church. Stewardship is something that should be an ongoing conversation about our world and our place in it.

Stewardship is defined as the job of supervising or taking care of something; we steward the resources we have been given. Theologically speaking, we understand that all that we have belongs to God; that the world and all that is in it belongs to its Creator. This then means that you and I are stewards, caretakers of our corner of creation. We are stewards of the possessions we have, the time we have been given and the abilities and talents God has gifted to us.

Time, talent, and treasures are helpful ways to begin to think about our own resources and our own stewardship. Not everyone has or can give richly from the treasures they possess; the reality is that some have more than others. But in stewarding resources for God it is important to remember that it

is not the quantity that matters but what that quantity represents. Jesus gives us a remarkable story about the wealthy making the big show of their offerings in the temple and the widow who gives only two pennies. Of course, there were much larger gifts than hers in worldly terms, but in God's eyes, the sacrifice she made to give even this little bit is seen and known and more valuable to God than the giving of what is left over.

Time is another resource we can give back to God. The time spent serving others, sharing life with those in need of support, and volunteering are of deep value as well. Time is precious in our world as we seem to have less and less of it to give. The hours spent giving of yourself to the church or to others is something that cannot be valued in monetary equations, time is something we do not get back and yet we also know from experience that time is a gift that enriches us even as we give. How often have you learned more from those you served than they did from you?

The same can be said of our talents also known as spiritual gifts. Scripture tells us that every person, no matter who they are is gifted by the Holy Spirit in some way. The beauty of it is that we are not all gifted in the same ways, and while you may look with envy on the gifting or ability of another, that does not mean that God has not gifted you in unique and precious ways. I Corinthians 12



reminds us that we are all individually a part of the body and that we need all of the parts of the body in order to function. If you teach, we need you. If you pray, we need you. If you are gifted in finance, technology, creativity, or music, we need you. God chooses to gift us differently because God chooses to have us work together in community rather than alone in isolation.

You are a steward then of the time, talent, and treasures that God has given to you. How are you choosing to care for those resources? How are you stewarding all that you have been given? What lies hidden within you that has not yet been used or shared? What needs cultivation and care? How are we, as a congregation, using the talents, treasures and time we have been given?

Consecration Sunday will be October 20, 2019. Will you take the time to reflect on how you steward your resources and what you might give to God?



WHAT IS SAID HERE, STAYS HERE.


Since Peter's letters are simple to understand, our class wanted to repeat I Peter which we did.


If you would be interested in helping to make a community meal happen, please see Pastor Edie. A planning meeting will be set soon and advertised in the bulletin.
