A LETTER FROM REV. EDIE

This month we celebrate Thanksgiving. Historically, Thanksgiving has been a holiday se


Thanksgiving has been a holiday set aside for prayer and gratitude to God. We often conjure up images of Native Americans, Pilgrims, and outdoor wooden tables laden with good food when we think of the first Thanksgiving. This origin story is firmly planted in our minds, but for centuries before, people of faith gathered at the time of harvest to give thanks to God for another year of produce. The ancient Israelites celebrated Shavuot, known to us as the Feast of Pentecost which celebrated the first fruits of harvest; giving thanks to God for the gifts of the earth. People throughout history have celebrated and gave thanks to their God for the good things of this world

In the United States, the first official day of Thanksgiving was declared by President Washington in 1789, but was not created a federal holiday until 1863 by then President Abraham Lincoln, in the midst of the Civil War. It is ironic then to reflect that often the times we have been most grateful for what we have are times we have been enduring the most. As the Civil War raged, Lincoln set into law a day of prayer and thanks to be given to God. I wonder then what our ancestors would make of our celebrations these days? I wonder if a part of the reason that Thanksgiving has waned

in importance in recent generations is that we often take for granted all that we have to be thankful for?

It can be easy when things are busy but smooth, when things are going well or even okay to take for granted all that we have. It is easy to slip into a sense of self-assurance or comfort, forgetting the blessings, sacrifices, and gifts that have gotten us to where we are. It seems that we often need a hardship, a struggle or a loss to remind us of all that we have to be thankful for and just who it is that has provided so much for us. Give *thanks* is a command given to us throughout scripture, notice what you have, who has been faithful to you and rejoice, be thankful. Give thanks is one of the first lessons we teach our children when we insist that they learn to say thank you. Give thanks in all circumstances. Paul tells the church in Thessalonica. Remember, that all we have is a gift.

For some of you this has been a difficult year and it can be hard to be thankful. For others of you, it has been another year that seems to run into the rest and you may be giving thanks for some of the blessings you've received. No matter where you find yourself, two things are true above all else: God is faithful, even when we can't quite see it and we have much for which to give thanks. As for me, this has been a year of dramatic change and transition that actually began about a year ago in



my first few conversations with the search team. In this season, as I reflect on the ways that God has been faithful--in bringing my family together and providing what we needed when we needed it. As I reflect on God's call to this particular congregation and you as God's people, I am struck again with gratitude and the reminder that no matter what, God is faithful.

This season, I invite you to look around at all God has given you, all that has been provided and give thanks. Give thanks for the small steps of progress and the sweeping moments that change everything. Give thanks for the joys and the places God has met you in grief or sorrow. *Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances.* (I Thess. 5:16-18)

I am thankful for you all!




