A LETTER FROM REV. EDIE

Advent means waiting, anticipation, coming... but when


I look around it seems that Christmas has already arrived. I saw the first glimpse of Christmas decorations before Halloween. Commercials with Santa began on November 1 and the grocery store was playing Christmas music two weeks ago. In our mad rush to enjoy all things Christmas, we miss the waiting require for the coming of Christ. Our world has divorced the faith-filled meaning of Christmas from the celebrations of lights and consumerism (not that this is a new issue – read A Christmas Carol for proof) and while we also enjoy many of these traditions, it is vital that we also remember why we celebrate. It is important that we as God's people slow down, pause, and wait for the coming of Christ.

When I was a kid, family tradition dictated that the morning after Thanksgiving, Christmas began in our home. The Friday many spent shopping was always spent hauling box after box of decorations out of our basement and sprinkling the entire house in Christmas decorations. Except for one small item. You see though my mom had several Nativity sets, she was adamant that Jesus does not come until Christmas. This meant that as kids, all of the Nativity sets, except for the one we were allowed to play and pretend with, had no Jesus in them for the entire season; until Christmas Eve. Jesus was simply nowhere to be found because – he hadn't been born yet. Mom would confiscate all the Jesus figures and hide them away and then on Christmas Eve they were set in place – the Christ child born and laid in a manger.

As kids, this seemed just a strange quirk that comes from mom having started a second career in ministry when the kids went off to school. We were the only family we knew whose mom hid Jesus, and it became something of a running joke. But now, as I reflect each year on the rush to Christmas, it has become important to me that I also learn to pause, to slow down, to anticipate and ves, to wait. Advent is about waiting; we are waiting not just for the celebration to remember the birth of the Messiah. We are waiting for Christ to come again. We are waiting for the reign of God to set all things right, for the new heaven and the new earth to be ushered in among us. Still we are waiting.

This waiting has purpose, it is not just sitting around, it is anticipation. The waiting of Advent is pregnant (pun intended) with symbols and signs. The waiting of Advent is about hope in what is to come in the Messiah. The waiting of Advent is about peace, the peace of Christ that reigns in our hearts, but also the shalom of God that will one day rule over all things. The waiting of Advent is about joy, the joy that can only come from the gift of God. And finally, the waiting of Advent is about love, the love that God has for each of us as children, not just believers. We are beloved of God: this is why the Son came in the first place.

In this season of beauty, busyness, and celebrations; I want to invite you



to slow down, pause, and wait. Wait for the promise of God to be fulfilled. Anticipate not just the coming of the baby, but the new creation. Pause, give yourself space for quiet reflection, as we anticipate the gift that is the Emmanuel – God with us. It is in Advent, in waiting, in the already and the not yet that we, like Mary prepare for the birth of the one who changed everything. It is in Advent that we prepare our hearts and our lives for the one who is to come.

A very blessed Advent to you all.




