A LETTER FROM REV. EDIE

He was going on a

journey. . . Scripture says that Jesus "set his face towards Jerusalem." There were many who tried to talk him out of the journey, they knew the chief priests and the elders would try again to put Jesus to death if he were to go to Jerusalem. This journey was something his disciples could not understand, why would someone willingly go to their death. Peter tried to stop him and Jesus said, "Get behind me Satan, you are setting your mind not on heavenly things but on human." Jesus was on a journey and only God could stop him.

He was going on a journey that he recognized as essential for humanity, yet he also prayed if it were possible, if there were another way that the cup be taken from him. Jesus didn't desire his death, he desired to do the will of God – even unto death. Doing the will of his Father is why Jesus came and he was willing to do all that God asked of him.

Lent is a journey. In the ancient church the 40 days of Lent (not counting Sundays) were laid out as a time of preparation for those seeking to be baptized. This time of preparation included fasting, catechism, spiritual renewal and reflection. Those seeking baptism devoted this time to learning and reflection on how much they needed the presence of Christ in their lives. After their time of preparation, they would gather the Saturday night before Easter morning to participate

in the sacrament of baptism.

Baptism served as a reminder of death and resurrection; its direct tie to Easter morning was intentional. Those who believe and are baptized are a new creation. The old has gone, the new has begun. In descending into the water, they were acknowledging their need to die to their sins and to themselves. In rising out of the water, they were remembering that Jesus Christ rose again from the dead.

As the Lenten season begins, it is important that we remember that we also are on a journey. Faith is

not a destination that we have obtained, but a life-long journey with the one who gave us life. Faith is about learning to walk with Jesus, learning to do the things he would do if he were living your life, learning to speak as he would speak, going to places Jesus would go. Individually, Lent is a time of invitation to take stock of our hearts and minds, to pay attention to where we are and where God is

calling us. Lent is a time of wondering again about how we live the commandments of Jesus: "Go and make disciples of all nations," "Love the Lord your God with all of your heart, mind, soul. And love your neighbor as you love yourself." I wonder how each of us might slow down and listen a bit more to the call and opportunities Jesus sets before us.

Together we are on a journey as well, together we seek to be the people of faith in this world. Together we gather to seek, share, celebrate, and serve. Together we encourage, support, and challenge one another. Together we seek to grow in our relationship with Christ. In this Lenten season, I invite you to look around you – look at the work of God being done, look at the places of need, the people you know who need to hear the good news. Lent is the reminder of a journey from death to life, from crucifixion to resurrection. It is Jesus' journey and we are invited to follow



POP TABS

Hickory Hills Presbyterian Church (HHPC) has been collecting pop tabs for many years. Where have these tabs gone? They have been donated to The Ronald McDonald Houses at Loyola Medical Center and Advocate Children's Hospital's Oak Lawn Campus (formerly known as Advocate HOPE Children's Hospital).

HHPC reached a goal of donating 1 million tabs to Loyola several years ago. Our accomplishment is documented within The Ronald McDonald House at Loyola.


Discipleship Report (cont'd.)

In 2011 HHPC delivered 223 pounds of pull tabs to the Oak Lawn facility. This is the equivalent of 282,541 pull tabs.

In 2014 HHPC delivered 166 pounds of pull tabs to the Oak Lawn facility. The 166 pounds of pull tabs are equal to 210,322 pull tabs.

In 2020 there are 23 containers of pull tabs in our building. When donated, this will add an additional 80 pounds of pull tabs to our donation. This represents an additional 101,360 pull tabs.

The donations from 2011, 2014, and what is in our church will be 594,233 pull tabs. HHPC is more than halfway toward reaching our goal of 1 million pull tabs donated to the Ronald McDonald House Charities in Oak Lawn. Keep collecting more pull tabs and continue bringing them to HHPC!

1 cup = 196 pull tabs

1 mile = 63,360 pull tabs laid end to end
