A Letter from Rev. Edie

HHPC VISIONING 2021 MEETING 2 SUMMARY

At our first set of meetings, we refocused on *WHY*--what brings us together and keeps us together.

We are at our strongest and most passionate when we are service-oriented, when we are working for and with others; we long to see our building used, our ministries, and our work together reflecting this serviceoriented movement. Families matter to us – while we do not have many children right now, we are passionate about multigenerational ministry. We want to find ways to connect, support, and walk with families of all shapes and sizes. We are a people of worship and prayer; our worship together is central to who we are, as are our meals and gatherings around tables. Most of are here and continue to be here because HHPC is family. We want to grow, to strengthen but with a goal of connection and care for one another not just numbers and names on a list. We are called to do life with one another and those who will join us. It takes time to build relationships and connections, but it is the kind of work we have valued most about our membership at HHPC. We envision a church on a mission to serve that is multi-generational and happening all week long, not just on Sunday morning.

We want to find ways to connect, support, and walk with families of all shapes and sizes.

- In conversation and in our silence, we affirm that THIS is our **WHY**:
 - It is who we believe God is calling us to be;
 - It is who God has created us to become.

Naming this is only a first step. There are some things in us that will need to change, there are priorities, learning, goals that will have to be set to move toward this future. But we as the leaders

of HHPC affirm that *THIS* is where we are called; this is where our efforts, energy and resources need to be directed.

Some emerging questions that we need to continue to unpack:

How will we balance the need for "keeping the lights on" (the operational side of our work) with the vision, imagination and desire to serve those who might not yet be committed to the church or might not have financial resources. In other words, we need operational and adaptive work - how do we find a balance? What does "outreach" look like in a changed world? What is the balance/connection between mission and outreach? How do we shift our thinking? How do we reframe our thinking about the church in the world and our role as Christ followers to be better able to follow Jesus?

Some starting points for these questions can be:

- Sermon series on our role in the world, mission, and the church today.
- Individual conversations that you have with one another and other members of the church.
- Stories being told in worship, newsletter, and other places of connection.
- More of these Visioning Meetings with committees and other groups in the church to share learning, wonder, and discern together.

We spent some time looking at the list of ministries, programs and committees in the church. Reality is that we are and have been a *VERY* active congregation, but that some of our efforts may not be matching our passions, some of our efforts maybe don't connect to our mission, and some of our efforts may need to be "retooled" or reset to better reflect our vision.

The questions each person answered about our list of activities from their perspective were:

• What of these are most important to you? Where are you spending energy and passion the most?

- Big picture What are we doing now that aligns with the **WHY** that we identified?
- Big picture Is there anything on this list that does not align with our why, or could be a distraction or contradiction?

This exercise revealed a wide variety of passions and energies spread across much of the life of the church. It was named that some of the things that we spend our time and energy on may not be the things we identify as being passionate about. This is worth paying attention to. This particular exercise is a place that I believe needs careful discernment and a willingness to be honest. I think that it is a great first step and a place to begin getting curious. This exercise was not intended to determine a future, but to begin wondering about alignment. Several of our committee and ministry heads have already asked for a copy of what emerged to share with their groups.

Framing and Next Steps

We have a clear picture of our current reality. We have looked and need to continue to look honestly at where we are now. There are some things to grieve, some things to recover, and some

energy to harness. We have a very clear "Emerging Future" together; we have crafted a vision of where we believe God is calling us. What happens next is the hard work of discerning, setting goals, and making decisions about **HOW** we go about moving towards that future. This is what I would call, "building the bridge while we walk on it." Reality is that we need to keep our eyes on where we are going while taking faithful small steps to get us there; it will take time to build our bridge toward God's emerging future.

In the coming months, you will be invited to join this conversation. I want to encourage everyone, when asked, to be a part of this time of discerning the work of Hickory Hills Presbyterian Church in the future.

It can be beneficial to spend time each day in personal reflection to help you understand who you are now and who you'd like to become as a follower of Jesus Christ.








What's a hymn without

words? Not much! When we sing, it is the lyrics that emotionally connect us to life experiences. When we sing hymns, they lift us up as prayer to invoke God's grace and love. I cannot think of praising the Lord without song and music.

Frances Jane Van Alystyne (nee Crosby, 1820-1915), more affectionally known as Fanny Crosby, was one of the most prolific hymn writers of the 19th and early 20th centuries. She wrote over 8,000 hymns and gospel songs during her lifetime that have appeared in hymnals of all denominations. In addition. she composed hundreds of poems (published in 4 *volumes*), scores of songs, and 5 cantatas on biblical and patriotic themes.


Fanny's work among the poor and rescue missions was well-known, and she was an avid public speaker on behalf of the less fortunate and the blind. In fact, she was blind herself since early childhood. Fanny was the first woman to address a joint session of Congress in 1846 as a lobbyist in support of education for the blind. She also performed her own musical compositions in the music room of the White House for President Polk and his wife.

And, yes, she was an ancestor to the Crosby brothers, Bing and Bob!



During June, I will perform several of Crosby's most endearing hymns, arranged by composer/arranger Lloyd Larson. It is my hope that the selections will encourage our hearts to express the truths of our faith in our lives and the lives of others.
