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A Letter from Rev. Edie

"In the bulb, there is a flower in the seed, an apple tree, in cocoons, a hidden promise butterflies will soon be free. In the cold and snow of winter, there's a spring that waits to be unrevealed until its season; something God alone can see."
-Hymn of Promise by Natalie Sleeth

These are the words to the first verse of one of my favorite hymns. As I sit looking out the window at a snowy yard, glazed over with a layer of ice, I am struck by the words of this verse. Beneath the snow, ice, and cold there lies the promise of spring. Beneath the layers of protection offered the ground as it hibernates in winter lies the promise of beauty, growth and green. By the cold days of February, when we grow tired of coats, cold, and grey; it is often this promise of spring that buoys our spirits, keeps us hoping and anticipating. It is the promise of spring's beauty that often makes the

Unrevealed, until its season... waiting, planning, anticipating, hoping, longing. These words are all invoked as I wonder about the waiting, the time in-between. We have done a lot of waiting the past few years, haven't we? Waiting for the pandemic to ebb, waiting for things to return to normal, whatever that is. Waiting for a clearer direction, better understanding, more wisdom and knowledge. We wait in the church as well, we wait for the clear directive of God for a way we should go. We wait for the still small voice

of our Savior to assure us that we are indeed being faithful. We wait during Advent for the birth of Christ. We wait in Lent for the drama and salvation of Holy Week and the joy of Easter resurrection. Waiting can be particularly hard when we do not know the end of the waiting, when we do not yet clearly see what it is we are waiting for.

What is to be is not always clear is it? I wonder, what are you waiting for?
What clarity, understanding, or direction do you seek?
What are the things you have set aside, paused, or promised yourself that someday, when things are quieter, calmer, less busy, you will pick them back up? What are the hopes that you have paused? What is it that you are seeking? It can be


hard to keep waiting, we easily lose patience, give up, or just move on. It is the waiting that is so hard.

But even the waiting is not without good purpose. We wait, but we also have time to prepare. We anticipate, but that time is a gift in which we can pause, listen, and discern the call of God. It is in winter that the ground rests, the seeds lie dormant and wait to burst forth. It is in waiting that we can begin to gather real excitement and anticipation for what comes next. It is in waiting that God comes and sits beside us, when we are still and open to God's presence. I want to invite you into this space of in-between, not as something to be endured or just gotten through, but as an opportunity to be in the presence of God. An opportunity to reflect, discern and wonder.

In this shortest (but longest) month of the year, I invite you to be curious. I invite you to pause and anticipate. What lies ahead that only God can see; can you also catch a glimpse? What are the promises that we cannot yet grasp but that God will indeed fulfill? What might God be calling you, or calling us as a people to? What opportunities have we not noticed, or been prepared to see that God will reveal? You see even in our pauses, moments of

uncertainty, or moments of rest, God is not idle, God is active and moving. Our God calls us and keeps calling. Our God is with us in the grey days of winter just as much as the bright, hopeful days of spring. Unrevealed, until its season, something God alone can see, even in you.

Community Meal


Our next drive thru community meal will be held on **February 7, from 5:30 p.m.** – **6:00 p.m.** We are always looking for assistance to cook, pack meals, or distribute. You are also invited to stop by and pick up dinner for yourself or a neighbor. The menu for February: Hamburger Vegetable Soup, bread, dessert.

MISSIONS OF THE MONTH

January – Share the Warmth. We are continuing to collect warm clothing items. Hats, gloves, and scarves, but also new socks and underwear. We will be donating these items at the end of the month to The Center for their "Share the Warmth" event.

February – Bottle Caps. Many of you are already collecting your caps to donate towards our goal of 1,200 lbs. of bottle caps. This will enable us to replace our two wooden picnic tables and make a second smaller bench. We have already collected, sorted, and weighed 670 lbs. But there are a lot of bottle caps in containers that need to be sorted and checked. In the month of February, there will be stations set up in the gym for sorting of caps. You can help with this anytime, stop in the church during the week, stay after bible study, take some time before or after worship. Michael Swearingen has been working to refine this process and we will have instructions available for you. Michael will provide us with an updated weight after we have processed the caps we have in February.

March – Feed My Starving Children. Meal pack will be in March. Stay tuned for a sign-up sheet in March. In the mean time you can help this ministry by taking an M&M container from the entry to the church and filling it with quarters. These tubes of quarters are a great way to provide meals for those in need throughout the year.



The Heart and Love of God

There are at least three different saints called Valentine, all of them martyrs and are mentioned in the early martyrologies of the Church under the date of February 14. One is described as a priest in Rome, another a bishop of Terni, and the other a missionary in Africa.
