

A Letter from Rev. Edie

As we enter the 11th month of 2022, I want to

invite you to reflect back on the year. Yes, I am aware it is only November, but if we are honest, we don't normally pause in the midst of the rush of the holidays to think back. If we reflect on the year at all, it is usually after January has already started, when all the parties, events, and obligations are finished and we are starting into the darker winter months. So, reflect with me a little as you prepare for all that November and December will bring.

On Epiphany Sunday, way back in January, I offered to all of you who were present a "Star Word." This word was a gift, chosen at random for you to reflect and ponder, to hold for the coming year.

Do you remember what your "Star Word" was? Maybe like me, you put it somewhere you can see it regularly, a reminder of God's word for you this year. Maybe you put it in a drawer, on a shelf, or in the recycle bin, figuring you would remember on your own. Perhaps you have no memory at all of the word you were given, or you were not present. If you can, remember back – what word were you given to contemplate? How has that word been reflected in the past year? How might you reflect on it now?

I would then invite you, whether you remember your word or not, to think back over the past year.

What are the meaningful events or moments? What are the challenges you faced? Are there themes or recurring patterns that you notice? Take some time to be still enough to remember, to allow your mind to wander, to see what, perhaps, you have been too busy or hurried to take note of. As you reflect back, notice where God has been at work. Where have you seen God's presence in the moment?

Where can you see God acting now, but you couldn't in the moment? I don't know about you, but I often find myself more aware of God's presence in hindsight than in the moment.

My own "Star Word" this year was "Experience." If you walk into my office, you will see my star posted on my computer monitor. All year I have been wondering – what does God have to say to me about experience? As I reflect back, I can begin to notice a few things.

This summer marked 20 years since my ordination into ministry. There are 20 years of ministry experiences, challenges, and blessings I have been a part of and received.

There are experiences in my life I return to again and again

that were formative and painful. These experiences may be things I wish I had never experienced, but they have made me the person and pastor I am. Even difficult experiences can be made valuable by God.


I sometimes discount my experiences; it is easy to compare ourselves with others, or to be hard on ourselves. It is important for me to remember that my experiences are my own; I am uniquely created for the purposes God has given me.

There is always more to experience. God is not done with me, or with any of us; there is a

world of experiences ahead of me if I am open and willing to follow.

These are just a few of my own reflections on the past year, but also on my "Star Word." I want to invite you to reflect, to wonder, to listen to God. Take some time to slow down, get present to yourself and to God and wonder. What might God have to say to you?


FAITHWALKING UPDATE

Mission Report

Here is a recap of what has been done so far and what remains through the end of 2022.

January – Share the Warmth (homeless shelter in Joliet) -HHPC participating with *The Center*; Beds Plus with helping the homeless in Chicago.

February – Collected **bottle caps**, washed and sorted under the direction of Michael Swearingen.

March – Feed My Starving Children (FMSC).

April - Collected donations for humanitarian aid to **Ukraine and tornado cleanup assistance throughout Southern Illinois/Western Kentucky.**

May - Grace Seeds Ministry, Share the Harvest.

June – Collected packages for the military (4 Care Packs were sent out).

July – M&M containers collected for FMSC (\$88 feeds a child for one year).

August – M&M containers collected for FMSC; we set a goal of \$500.

September – Sent \$255 in donations for those affected by Kentucky flooding.



October – FMSC packing event on October 29th; 9 individuals signed up.

November – Blessing Baskets - collecting pantry items for 28 days. Items will be split between HHPC Micro-Pantry and Elsie's Pantry. Continuing to collect M&M containers for FMSC – next packing date is set for December 17. Donations for our Warming Tree will be collected starting this month, and all items will be displayed on the tree.

December – Donated items from our **Warming Tree** *(see p. 10)* will be distributed between HHPC Micro-Pantry, homeless shelters (Beds Plus and Share the Warmth).

We will also collect **Christmas Gifts for Children** for the Jones Center.

Church Musician's Corner by Greg Rolla

Did you know that there are 138 passages of Scripture on the subject of thanksgiving? Unfortunately, few hymns are actually written for thanking God.

Now Thank We All Our God is one hymn that we know and love. It was written by Martin Rinkart (1586 - 1649), a Lutheran pastor in Eilenberg, Saxony.

During the Thirty Years' War in Germany, refugees flooded the town. The Swedish Army encompassed the city gates, and inside the walls there was nothing but plague, famine and fear. Over 800 homes were destroyed and people began to die in great numbers. It became difficult for the town's pastors to preach, care for the sick and dying, and bury the dead.

Soon, the pastors themselves took ill and perished until Rinkart was left. By himself, he negotiated with the enemy, and did it with great courage and faith. Soon, hostilities ceased. Knowing that there is no healing without thanksgiving, Rinkart composed this hymn for the survivors of Eilenberg. It quicky became one of our most popular hymns.

This month, let us make a conscious effort to thank our God for the numerous blessings He has bestowed on us, even in the midst of suffering.








