A Letter from Rev. Edie

As Lent draws

to a close, as we walk the lonely road to Gethsemane, and join the women as they draw near to the tomb, it can be tempting to just cast aside the patterns, habits, and even the things we might have given up or taken on for Lent. It might be tempting to just be done with our Food for the *Soul* theme and move on to other things. But before we do, I want to invite you to pause.

Pause with Jesus before he takes a seat on the donkey and enters Jerusalem. Linger at the table with the disciples, spend a little extra time listening to the words of Jesus as he breaks the bread, pours the cup, and passes them around the table. Don't flee from the garden in the darkness or move too quickly through the suffering of the Friday we call Good. Walk the road this Holy season and wonder, look for clues, how did Jesus nourish his own soul? How do we see Jesus caring for himself and seeking nourishment as he prepares for his death?

Then as Easter morning dawns, as we gather together around the tables, as we eat bacon and celebrate the risen Christ; what nourishment is provided for the



rest of us? As we fill our bodies, can we also find nourishment for our souls in the celebrations? As we walk through different stories of the resurrection, as the disciples meet again and again with the risen Christ, notice how many of those encounters involve food. Over and over, Jesus cares not just for our hearts or souls, but our bodies as well. Again and again, it becomes clear, God is concerned with all of us, our whole selves.

God cares for us throughout the year, not just in seasons of preparation like Advent and Lent. God cares for us in the ordinary and the extraordinary. In what ways are you experiencing this provision? In what ways are you longing for more; finding yourself tired, parched, or hungry for something beyond where you are today? What might be the food for your soul that you need?

Finally, I want to invite you to be curious. Curious about your own soul, but also about the soul of the congregation (and our communities). How can we nourish one another well? How can we learn more about the needs of others to be a people who are always about: *Seeking God's word, Sharing and Celebrating God's Love and Serving Jesus Christ in the World*.

I guess what really drew me into Faithwalking was that I was curious about what more I might learn about myself and my faith at this point in my life journey.


Well, as it turned out, my curiosity really led me to a place of discovery where I received a clearer understanding of myself and an awareness of how my faith has always guided me.


