A Letter from Rev. Edie

The season of Pentecost is upon us. Within the church, this means Sunday we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit, the gift of the Advocate who Jesus promised would be and remain with us until his return. It means that on Sunday we decorate with red, celebrate with the bright flames of the Spirit. But Pentecost is not just a Sunday that we mark as significant in the life of the church, it is that, in fact, we can trace the very beginning of "the church" - not the buildings, the gathered groups of believers to the festival of Pentecost. It was on Pentecost that the disciples began to make disciples – these births worshiping communities, something we now call a church. But, Pentecost is not just a day of celebration in the church. the season of Pentecost is the longest of all our seasons. The season of

Pentecost stretches from the end of May to the end of November, the season of Pentecost, the season of the Spirit, stretches for more than half our calendar year.

But our calendars mark other seasons, too, don't they? As we enter the season of Pentecost, the dramatic gifting of the Spirit, we also enter into the season of summer. In contrast to the burst of energy and excitement and drama of Pentecost, we often think of the summer season in the church as a time of slowing, a time of rest from the programs of the school year. At HHPC we end May with a burst of energy and effort that results in our Indoor Yard Sale, which was a huge success this year (thank you to everyone who made it possible!). We then spend time preparing for VBS which follows rapidly on the heels of the sale. The end of spring and beginning of summer are times of big



events here at HHPC. But those are the big events. Summer tends to be a quiet season here at HHPC, a season in which many people travel, have family events, head off to cottages. Summer can be a quiet season, even as it is marked on the church calendar as the season of the coming of the Spirit – Pentecost.

How do we reconcile these two realities? Should we be doing more? Is there something different that should happen? If we are willing to acknowledge the tension between the gifting of the Holy Spirit with the burst of energy for the followers of Jesus and our own summer slow-down, what do we do with it? I think we can begin by

paying attention to the rhythms and seasons that God gave us from the beginning of creation. In the beginning, we are told, God created the world in 6 days and rested on the 7th. Sometimes we think of this as the 6 days of creation. But really, it is 7 days. Sabbath rest is a part of creation. The day of rest was created by God as surely as the trees, flowers, and even the mosquitos. Sabbath is a part of creation, though in our hurriedness, we have often forgotten Sabbath is a part of God's gift of creation to us. The rhythm of rest and work, Sabbath and the rest of the week is an important one, one that we often do

not honor. In the summer when things seem to slow down a little, perhaps this is the time to reestablish for ourselves the regular rhythm God intended-work AND Sabbath.

The other opportunity we have is to notice the seasons. There are seasons of the year in terms of weather, but these vary throughout our world – our summer is another's winter. But the rhythm God gives is the same. In this summer season, as things begin to slow a bit at church. I want to invite you to take this as an opportunity – an opportunity to rest in the presence of God, to receive the gift of Sabbath. Take not only an hour or two on Sunday morning as a time for

worship, but the full day as a day of rest. Choose a practice of reading scripture, prayer, silence to engage in these months. Take up a book, prayer walking, or a regular time of connection with others. Choose a slower, but intentional rhythm of growing your faith. Give yourself permission to be still in the presence of God. As we enter into a Sabbathing time in the church, come and be present, come and engage, come and be with one another without 1,000 other things to get done. Come, be still with the Spirit given us that we might bless others.


Our next **Community Meal** is scheduled for Monday, June 5, 2023, from 5:30 to 6:00 p.m.

- white wine or plain vinegar
- kosher salt
- freshly ground black pepper
- sugar

Try This Recipe!

Creamy Pasta Salad

Directions

- 1. In a large pot, cook the pasta according to the directions on the package, adding a generous tablespoon or so of kosher salt to the water as it cooks.
- 2. Just before the noodles are done cooking, add the broccoli to the pot. Let the broccoli boil for about 30 seconds and then drain everything into a large strainer. Rinse well with cold water.
- 3. Stir together the mayonnaise, vinegar, salt, pepper, and sugar in a large mixing bowl.
- 4. Add the cooked pasta and broccoli to the bowl and stir well to coat.
- 5. Add the cucumber, pepper, olives, and onions and stir again.
- 6. Taste and adjust seasonings, if needed. Cover and refrigerate until ready to serve. Stir again just before serving.


