

A Letter from Rev. Edie

When you stop and listen, what voices do you hear? When you take a little time to reflect, notice where you are, what you have been up to – what voices do you hear? We all have them. They can be voices of approval or disapproval. They can be voices telling us what we ought to be or should be doing different, voices that remind us who we are or who we are not. Sometimes they are voices that ask deep and meaningful questions about our place in the world or God's work in our lives. Sometimes they are self-sabotaging, asking "who do you think you are?" Some of these voices are our own, our old stories, longings and hopes; our own wisdom born out of experience. Some of these voices are inherited – the voices of those who influenced us as children. teens, or young adults. But if we are still long enough, if we quiet some of those negative voices a little longer, we can also hear the still, small voice of God.

Scripture is full of voices speaking to God, about God, and for God. Sometimes we even hear from God directly. "A voice cries out..." is our theme for Advent this year. The voice of the prophet who predicted the coming of Christ generations earlier. The voice of John the Baptizer crying out to the crowd in the wilderness

that the Messiah has some. The voice of Mary, the mother of Jesus, singing of God turning the world upside down. These voices of praise, warning and possibility are voices not just for those long ago, but voices for us as well.

What is the cry of the prophets for us in this season? What is it that we have to learn, to receive, to accept?

A voice cries – hope A voice cries – peace A voice cries – joy A voice cries – love

A voice cries, cries in distress and anger at the shock of cold air, cries in need for nurture, warmth, nourishment. Cries as only a newborn baby can cry – Emmanuel. God with us. God offering us hope, peace, joy, and love.

But it isn't enough to hear the words, is it? It isn't enough for the voices to cry out and tell us to feel something that is so far away or to find something that seems to have eluded us. The Voice that cries out, the very voice of God, is a voice of assurance and of command. This is a voice that insists on possibility even when



all we can see when we look around is despair and destruction. This is a voice that insists on responsibility and action even when it would be much easier to run and hide, to lock our doors, to pretend that if we can just muster the feeling that will be enough.

As we enter the Advent Season, we are invited to stop and listen. We are invited to hear the cries and respond. We are invited into the possibility that the promises of God are not far away or someday, they are here and now, urgent, immediate, today. In the middle of the rush, the doing, the events and responsibilities – Stop. Listen. God is still speaking. God is still present with us, even as we anticipate the coming of the Christ Child, even as we anticipate his return. Still, God is with us.

You are the one who carries hope, peace, joy, and love into the world. You, all of you together, are the people who offer a glimpse of God's goodness. Where have you heard the voice? Where have you caught a glimpse of God? How will you respond?






ATTENTION BIBLE STUDY GROUP







THESE CCIPES?

CANDIED PECANS



Ingredients

- 1 cup white sugar (see Test Kitchen Tip below)
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/4 to 1/2 teaspoon salt, or to taste
- 1 large egg white
- 1 tablespoon water
- 1 pound pecan halves

Directions

- 1. Preheat the oven to 250 degrees F (120 degrees C).
- 2. Mix sugar, cinnamon, and salt together in a small bowl.
- 3. Whisk egg white and water together in a large bowl until frothy. Toss pecans in the egg white mixture to coat. Slowly pour in sugar mixture and stir until pecans are evenly coated. Spread onto a baking sheet.
- 4. Bake in the preheated oven for 10 minutes. Stir pecans and rearrange into a single layer. Continue to cook, stirring every 10 to 15 minutes, until pecans are evenly browned, another 30 to 50 minutes.

HOLIDAY HOT SPINACH DIP



Ingredients

- 1 (10 ounce) package frozen chopped spinach, thawed and drained
- ½ cup red bell pepper, diced
- 1 tablespoon minced garlic
- 1 (6.5 ounce) jar artichoke hearts, drained and mashed
- ½ cup sour cream
- ½ cup grated Parmesan cheese
- salt and ground black pepper to taste
- 1/4 cup heavy cream

Directions

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).

Mix together spinach, bell pepper, garlic, artichokes, sour cream, and parmesan cheese. Season with salt and pepper. Mixture will be thick; add cream to thin consistency. Spoon into a 1-quart baking dish.

Bake for 20 minutes, or until bubbly. Serve with crackers.
