A Letter from Rev. Edie



It has been a VERY busy first half of the year here at HHPC. Lent came early and we began our Soup Suppers right on the heels of Souper Sunday. This was quickly followed by Easter and the mammoth preparations for the Indoor Yard Sale. Just last week we had a blast with 24 kids participating in Vacation Bible School. (whew) It has been not just a busy, active season it has been a busy, active half a year. By contrast, it has been a very quiet week here at HHPC.

Sometimes, when things get quiet I get suspicious; something must be about to happen. Sometimes I feel disconcerted, there must be something I am supposed to be doing. Sometimes I am guilty of looking for something, anything to fill the stillness and quiet. But rarely when things get quiet do I simply take a deep breath and appreciate what I have, where I am and all that has been done. I suspect that more than a few of you are like me; struggling a little when space is created, unsure of what we are supposed to *DO* in the stillness. Rarely do I slow down and consider the possibility that God could be inviting me into rest.

This summer, I want to invite you into the quiet, into the stillness, into a month (or so) of Sabbath rest. Sabbath for some people brings up reminders of days gone by when everything was closed on Sunday. For others it is a reminder of the command to rest. Sabbath is a command, but the emphasis is not on requirement but on Sabbath as a good gift from a good God. Sabbath was gifted to God's people from the very beginning of creation. We are told that for six days, God labored to create the heavens and the earth and all that is in it; the capstone of

God's creating was humanity. "And on the seventh day, God finished the work that he had done, and he rested on the seventh day." The culmination then of God's work is rest. Something I had never really considered before, until listening to an episode of the Leader's Journey podcast (link is below if you want to hear it), was that the first thing human beings do in creation is *rest*. It is God who rests from work; it is humans who are given the gift of rest as the very first day after they are created.

Jesus reminds us, "The sabbath was made for humankind, and not humankind for the sabbath." A day of rest, a time of stillness, down time to relax is a gift of God for the people of God. For all our hurry, hustle, and activity we often forget the small, still voice of God inviting us to sit, be still, listen, just be in the presence of a God who loves us. The reality is that few of us take sabbath the way it was intended. We rush about, work hard, and when weekends or days off come, we use them to catch up on all the other things we haven't gotten done. It is an urgency born of proving our worth, being productive, having a culture that insists that our value is to be found in our earning, our worth in what we produce.

But God does not need us to produce more, do more, cross off one more thing on the list (no matter how satisfying it is). God wants our very selves, to be in relationship, to be open hearted and open handed, to be willing to risk waiting, resting, and inviting others to do the same.

July will be a quiet month at HHPC. Of course we will worship, study, fellowship and eat - but I hope you will also allow this month without events and programs to be a time of rest, a time to be restored, a gift from God for God's people. We will get moving soon, there will be much to do in the coming months, but for now what would it mean for you to simply be in worship, be in relationship, to be at rest? Will you encourage or offer this gift of rest to another?

Sabbath rest stands in sharp contrast to our need to be productive; sabbath is a reminder that we do not make the world go around. If we stop, it will not all fall apart, in fact, if we stop for a while it will likely all still be there again tomorrow. I would also encourage you to seek a regular practice of sabbath, if not a day of rest in a week, at least a carved intentional time for connection to other people and to God, without an agenda or a to do list attached to it.

"Jesus said, Come to me all you that are weary and carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke up on you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls." *Matthew* 11:28-29






Mission Committee Report Dave Delaney

The annual indoor yard sale was a great success, raising just under \$8,000. We sold a great deal of what was donated. But there was even more left over that did not sell. On Monday, May 20 we loaded the truck from Hearts In Motion with as much as they could take. An additional donation was made to the Salvation Army. What was left went to a group called Pass It On. They support Christian schools on the southwest suburban area.

On June 1 eight people associated with our church went to the Aurora facility of FMSC. The total number of boxes packed during the session we attended was 155, or a total of 33480 meals. Our team, and the one next to them, packed 49 boxes, nearly 1/3 of the total. These meals have already been shipped to Peru and Mozambique. We still want to attend more such sessions before the end of the year.

Over the years we have participated in many events at the Colbert Jones Memorial Center in Chicago Heights. For 30 of those years we had the pleasure of working with Cheryl Roop. But as of May 30 Cheryl retired, we will miss her. In her place Juana Morales has been named as interim director. Juana is a long time employee and is familiar with the whole operation. Our plans are to support the Jones Center as we have in past years.

Your Discipleship workers are using July and August to begin planning for our 24-25 Church/Sunday School year. Some dates to look forward to . . .




