

A Letter from Rev. Dr. Edie Lenz



"This is something you can get through or it is something you can grow through – it is your choice." These words of wisdom come from a former classmate in the Methodist tradition where pastors are appointed not selected. These appointments average 4-6 years but can be longer or shorter. This means that change is inevitable in ways we do not fully understand, or expect, almost all the time. In the last month she was notified that she would be moved, these profound words are the ones she has shared over and over with the congregation she serves as they struggle with an unexpected loss and transition (she was only there 4 years).

These are words for you (and I) as well. This is something you can get through or it is something you can grow through. HHPC has "gotten through" a lot of transitions, losses, and hard days. You are tenacious, determined, and yes, a little stubborn. You know how to get through things. You have, over the years, pulled together, taken on hard jobs, shared the load and made it through. You are a congregation that knows how to put your heads down and barrel through. You are a people who know how to come together and just make it work. But you are also not the people you were the last time you were in transition. You are not the congregation that made it through the last vacancy, you are a different people. What if this time God invites you to more than just getting through a transition. What if you chose to grow through this?

I know it sounds cliché at this point but attitude is a lot of it. How you talk to each other, how you act with one another, how you pray for the church and for one another all matter. The words you choose will have power, your determination to make it through or grow through this will change how you think about every part of a search process, how you imagine a next chapter of the church, and perhaps even the person you call next. Believing God's call is to grow through this opens a world of possibilities; and you have been practicing that for a while now.

One simple example of this is the way we have talked together about trying new things. New ideas are experiments to be learned from events or programs that will either sink or swim. If something is an experiment, it is a learning opportunity; you cannot fail unless you fail to learn something. Last October we tried a month of meals. We learned that we really like this disruption to the fall. We learned that people will gather in October and in Lent. We learned that four weeks is a good number; we learned that creativity in the meals and sharing the load across committees is a good idea. We also learned that SOMEONE has to take the lead. This was, however, an experiment; it doesn't have to happen in 2025, but it can. This can be something you do again or something you learned from and stop doing. You have already grown from it... therefore, no matter the turn out or the decision about this year, you have grown and learned.

My prayer for you, as a people who have loved me well and who I love, is that you will choose to grow and learn in this next chapter too. We have grown together, experimented, pivoted, tried all sorts of things. I believe God has work for you to do here, on this corner, at this time. I understand and I feel how uncertain it all feels right now. But you can choose to get through it or you can choose to grow through it. My abiding prayer for you in this next season is that you will choose to adventure together and grow, that you will continue to discover God's plans for you.


In recent weeks – there have been a flurry of reports of gift card scams. On Friday, May 16 many of you received an email pretending to be from Pastor Edie seeking gift cards.

While many of you are already aware of the dangers of these sorts of scams, it can be a helpful reminder to us all to pay attention to the email addresses being used, notice the wording being used and no matter who is asking, do not ever send images of gift cards through email.

If you receive a strange email, or an unexpected request from family, friends, or even the church, verify the request in a different way. Reach out via a phone call or text. Write a fresh email to the person who claims to be asking, make sure you use the email address you have for that person. Check in before you take action.

If you have fallen victim to this sort of scam you are not alone, you should not scold or shame yourself. People who are seeking to take advantage of others are very sneaky and creative. The important thing is to make sure it does not happen again and if you are able to report the email as a phishing scam. There are also ways to report these sorts of scams to law enforcement. 


